### Northeast Emergency Food Program

NEFP strives to meet the urgent food and clothing needs in the Portland metro area. There is no geographic boundary and NEFP serves anyone in the community who needs assistance, emergency or otherwise. The pantry supplies households with at least three-to-five days of groceries, up to three times within six months.

Food options include fresh fruits and vegetables, dairy, bread and meat.

The program also helps develop community solutions to improve access to affordable, healthy food. It offers a Service Learners Initiative that provides job training, skill building and exposure to nonprofit services.

Please arrive before 4 pm. If you would like to use any of their other services, you must bring something with your name on it, like an ID or piece of mail. However, no one will be turned away for lack of ID.



Come prepared to possibly wait, and if you are not arriving by car, bring extra bags, a cart or a suitcase to take the food home. The pantry is accessible by public transit via TriMet No. 71 and 72 buses.
