Program history

Native Americans in the United States, like those in Oregon, face many health problems. The Oregon Health Authority takes care of the health of 28,000 American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) people who are part of Medicaid (Oregon Health Plan). Nine tribes in the state wanted CareOregon's help with coordinating care. This partnership has made it easier for CareOregon to reach out to Native Americans and make sure they get the right kind of support. So far, more than 2,000 people have gotten help with their health care needs, showing that CareOregon is dedicated to helping the Native American community.



What we do

Our team of Tribal Care Coordinators is trained to understand and respect the unique cultures and histories of Native Americans. We know how important it is to be mindful of different cultures when it comes to health care, and we always strive to offer services that suit the needs of AI/AN Medicaid members. Our main aim is to build trust and strong relationships so that American Indians feel at ease and in control of their health. We connect members to various services, such as rides to medical appointments, community resources, support groups and education on staying healthy. We believe that by addressing social factors that impact health and providing thorough support, we can help AI/AN Medicaid members live healthier lives.



Eligibility

To qualify for Tribal Care Coordination, you must be recognized as Heritage Native American (HNA) through the Medicaid application process. Anyone with the HNA indicator and fee-for-service (FFS or "open card") Oregon Health Plan (OHP) coverage can use this service. If you choose to join a coordinated care organization (CCO) through OHP, you can access care coordination through your CCO plan. Insurance

Tribal Care Coordination is a free service for AI/AN OHP fee-for-service members through open card Medicaid. OHP will pay for your medical expenses if the services you receive are covered by it.
